

ONLINE LEARNING & PARTIAL RE-OPENING POLICY

All principles of the original 'Behaviour Policy' document are applicable unless stipulated or clarified below. This appendix will apply until further notice.

Uniform

Year 10 students will not be required to wear uniform when they attend their school sessions, however the dress code for non-uniform days applies, as well as the main school dress code for hair and jewellery.

A full dress code list can be found in students' planners or in the Behaviour Policy, but to clarify some of the points:

- Students cannot wear shorts or tops with bare midriffs.
- One small stud per ear in each ear lobe is allowed, but no other piercings.
- Hair should be of one natural colour.

Year 12 are expected to adhere to the Sixth Form Dress Code.

Please note that as in the existing policy where any student infringes the dress code and the item cannot be removed in school parents will be contacted to collect their child. During this period the school will not be able to loan students any replacement items for infringements.

Detentions & Sanctions

Detentions will not be operating under the current system, but disciplinary points will be centrally monitored. Where a student repeatedly disrupts the learning of others, or fails to follow instructions they will not be able to partake in face to face provision for an allotted period of time depending on the incident, and therefore will not be able to be in school. This will also be the case where a student is repeatedly in breach of social distancing measures, which will be treated as a Level 3 incident.

Any Level 3 or 4 incident will be dealt with as the current policy in regards to fixed term or permanent exclusions.

Online Lessons

Expectations of students in lessons online are the same for students in class, and in line with the 'Internet & Acceptable Use Policy – Students'.

To clarify points more pertinent for video lessons:

- Students should be dressed as they would do to leave the house (for example not in pyjamas). They do not need to be wearing school uniform.
- Students should be preferably sat at a desk/table, in a quiet area of the house (preferably not their bedroom) and free from distractions.
- Students should not photograph or record any section of the lesson under any circumstances. Doing this will result in instant removal from any further live lesson opportunities.
- Students should be respectful of other students in the group, and use appropriate language for the classroom environment.
- Only the students themselves should be joining in with the lesson, no other family members should be involved. This cannot only be distracting for everyone but also is inappropriate for parents to be viewing other students in the group.

Any student who does not adhere to appropriate lesson behaviour may be removed from any future live learning opportunities.

Environment & Personal Belongings

- Students must arrive at school at their allotted time and report immediately to their allocated room.
- Students must adhere to social distancing, keeping 2m from any person at any time (unless this person is in their household).
- Students will not be able to access their lockers.
- Students must only stay in the areas allocated to their group, including toilets.
- There will be no catering provision during this period for Year 10 & 12 students, students should bring their own food and drink (current provision will continue for the 'critical worker and vulnerable students' group).
- Students must follow government advice on washing their hands regularly and must ensure if they cough or sneeze this is contained, for example, in a tissue or by their upper arm.

Monitoring
